President's letter 2014

A few more than 10 years ago, people in our community came together with concern and hope wanting to bring positive change to the Latino students and families in our community. Nuestro Mundo, Inc was formed and Nuestro Mundo Community School was born.

Nuestro Mundo Community School continues to be the focus and largest project of NMI to date. The major accomplishment for first quarter of

2014 was completing the final steps of approving the management contract for NMCS with Madison Metro School District. This agreement was the culmination of months of hard work and collaboration among NMCS administration, NMI board members and MMSD staff. Thanks and appreciation to Principal Josh Forehand and NMI board member Peter Joyce for their role in seeing it through.

NMI is a proud Community Shares of Wisconsin member agency. CSW member agencies share a commitment to social justice, the environment and economic access for individuals, families and community. NMI relies on workplace giving through payroll deductions and CHIP donations at Willy Street Co-op. Each year support through CSW grows. We are honored and humbled by the generosity of donors.

Parents continue to drive fundraising at NMCS. Dana King has shown tireless commitment to smaller project based fundraising through sales of seeds, bread, Bucky Books and shirts. Concepción Mota took the lead in organizing and working at the second annual Tamalada. Carolina Castellanos and Mariana Castro, co-chairing the Liderazgo Committee supported dances and movie nights and other events which also provided some fundraising for the school. NMI is continually working to expand financial support through grants and in kind donations.

NMI hosted with Latino Education Council, Centro Hispano and Latinos United for College Education Scholarships the second Citywide Dual Language Immersion Summit at Centro Hispano. This Summit brought together teachers, parents, community members and administrators from across the district who have an interest in dual language immersion education. We continued to learn, build community and move forward in seeking excellence for our students through dual language immersion education. This event also included the 8th annual NMI Board of Education candidate forum. NMI is committed to continuing the conversations about improving education and parental involvement. The difficult decision was made to not host the popular Summer Program and instead funding was reallocated to pay for Saturday Literacy School for students who needed some additional assistance with reading skills. Parents and teachers reported success for students who were able to regularly participate. Snacks and transportation as well as regular classroom teachers were provided to support this important, intensive learning opportunity.

New Directors Pam Mc Gillivary, Peggy Rynearson, Rosalia Gittens and Virginia Escudero were installed to the NMI Board in July. We thanked Kristen Scott and Liz Kennebeck for their service.

The next few years will be an opportunity to grow the capacity and activity of our Board. Please join us on our path to greater academic success of our children and greater involvement of our parents and community partners. There is much to do. The stakes are high. Join us.

Bridging Committee

School Committee

Finance Committee:

The Finance Committee is responsible for complying with all federal and state regulations regarding NMI's 501c3 status. FY 2014 was a relatively good year for us financially, with over \$23,000 available for Program Support.
